

# The Hexagon House

This unique six-sided house was built between 1871-1874 by James Burgess. While no one knows for sure, he may have built the house to showcase the wares from his furniture business. Today, the Hexagon House is owned and maintained by the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley as office space for Preservation of Historic Winchester and the Shenandoah Arts Council. This holiday season, the PHW offices on the first floor will be turned into a boutique-style holiday gift shop featuring artisans from the Shenandoah Valley and surrounding regions. You are sure to find something delightful or delicious inside!

## The Back Porch

The main entrance to the Hexagon House is through the back porch, which features fewer steps and a wider door opening for easier access. Freshly-cut greenery, wreaths, and premade bows will be available at the porch and adjoining yard. Live greenery is expected to arrive after Thanksgiving.

## The Kitchen

The back porch leads to the kitchen, which will be the stage for our freshly baked treats, preserves, condiments, canned goods, and other foodstuffs. Keep an eye out for taste testing samples! A complimentary hot drink station will also be located in the kitchen.

## The Stair Hall

Through the left door of the kitchen is the staircase and the public restroom. While passing through, be sure to browse the selection of bath and body goods.

## The Parlor

The former living room will be gift-central this year, with jewelry, ornaments, home décor, notecards, handmade journals, felted creations, scarves, fine art and books on local history.

## The Foyer

The grand entrance to the Hexagon House will be reserved for a communal Christmas tree adorned with ornaments and a secondary checkout and Holiday House Tour ticket pick-up lane.

## The Dining Room

Be sure to browse the dining room for beautiful and functional wares like fine wheel-thrown pottery, handwoven baskets, and stained and fused glass vases and bowls.

## The Butler's Pantry

The main checkout line and packing station will be in the small butler's pantry between the dining room and kitchen, along with flyers, brochures, and Holiday House Tour tickets.
